Sarah Bates, the fourth daughter of Charles and Juliana Weeks, grew up in Greenville, South Carolina, before graduating high school in Atlanta, Georgia. She went on to earn her Bachelor of Arts in Speech and Theatre from Newberry College. After two successful decades in hospitality management in Charleston, Sarah shifted her career in 2001 to a field that quickly became her passion—school nutrition. She joined Charleston County School District's Nutrition Services, then known as the School Food Service Association (now SNA).

At her interview, she was asked what one change she would make in school food service. Her response—"Feed every child for free"—has guided her work ever since. Thanks to CEP, that vision is partly a reality, with 68 of 81 district schools now offering free meals to all students. Sarah moved into leadership as a Supervisor, overseeing up to 24 schools, and later became active in SNA. She served on the South Carolina SNA Board beginning in 2007 and as State President in 2009, attending national leadership and legislative conferences that deepened her understanding of the vital role school nutrition plays in student success.

Throughout her career, Sarah has helped launch and expand programs that continue to benefit students and families. She brought the Summer Meals Program to Charleston, managed the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program across 25 schools, and played a key role in rolling out the CACFP Supper Meals Program in 2013. She also led ServSafe certification training for more than 100 employees when it became mandatory, oversees the district's Mid-Morning Snack Program, and coordinates professional development for staff, drawing inspiration from state and national conferences each year.

Now in her 24th year with Charleston County, Sarah reflects that her most meaningful achievements are not only programs and policies, but the mentorships, friendships, and shared commitment to students built along the way.

Outside of her career, Sarah and her husband Dennis are active members of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Charleston, where she serves as Chair of the Altar Guild. She takes immense pride in her family—her four children and their partners, Kyle and Andrea, Jeffre and Tommy, John and Hannah, and Amanda and Jared—and her greatest joys: her four granddaughters, Eva, Georgie, Lilly, and Nora.


